A hearty and wholesome meal was necessary the preceding night. Punsch is a strong, sweet, arrack-based drink. Dinner is served with sharp Swedish cheese, bread, dessert and coffee and a cash bar. You do not want to miss out on this delightful meal which happened to be the favorite of the known Swedish author August Strindberg, who used to call it "food for the gods".
