**Can You Hear the Drums Calling?
Don't Miss the 2nd Annual
Drums Along the Delaware Powwow
At the American Swedish Historical Museum
Saturday, September 27, 2014 10am-7pm**

Philadelphia, PA- If you have ever wanted to experience an authentic Native American powwow, now is your chance! Join the ASHM and our Auxiliary Club as we host the 2nd annual "Drums Along the Delaware Powwow" on Saturday, September 27th from 10am to 7pm on the museum grounds. It will feature a variety of Native American performers and dancers, including popular Native American singer, Pura Fe. After working early in her career at Philadelphia's own *The Painted Bride*, Pura Fe has become a major player in highlighting traditional Native music, and blending its elements with contemporary popular music.

The Drum call begins at 11:30am and the Grand entry will be at 12pm, led by the Red Blanket and Medicine Horse drummers. Food, art and craft vendors will be on site all day, offering up everything from authentic fry bread to hand-made jewelry and baskets. Notable Piney Lenape basket makers, Mary and Steve Carty will also be present.

Admission is \$10 for a family of 4, \$5 for adults, \$3 for people under 18, seniors and ASHM members, free for children under 12. Fee also includes free admission to the museum with free parking just outside. Pay at the door.

The American Swedish Historical Museum is located in FDR Park at 1900 Pattison Avenue in South Philadelphia, five blocks west of the Sports Complex. The Museum is easily accessible from Route 95 or 76 and has free parking. For those taking public transportation, the Broad Street subway AT&T station, or SEPTA's Route 17 bus is within walking distance of the Museum.
