the beer, we will be offering a spread of delectable finger foods to satisfy your hunger and help you decide which beer goes best with Swedish meatballs, cheese and more. On the sweet side, specialty desserts will be served by Jeffrey Miller Catering and Pop's Homemade Water Ice. There will also be a raffle on site, with an array for interesting things to be had, from sports items to beer baskets and gift certificates. All proceeds from this event benefit the ASHM. Enjoy a fun evening, and help support the museum's programs. Weather permitting, it will be held outside, in the gorgeous museum courtyard overlooking FDR Park.
