During the market, shoppers can experience *the Lucia children's program* twice each day. Light, warmth, and Christmas songs have been hallmarks of the Lucia celebration at ASHM since 1939. December 13th is St. Lucia Day in Sweden, a holiday marked by Lucia celebrations all over the country from private homes to entire towns. The modern tradition of having public Lucia processions in Swedish cities started in 1927 when a newspaper in Stockholm elected an official Lucia for that year. ASHM's Lucia performances during our market include Swedish songs and dances performed by children dressed as Christmas *tomtar* (gnomes), *pepparkakor* (gingerbread cookies), folk dancers, star boys, and Lucia with her attendants. Don't miss out on this magical holiday experience!
